- Population at risk
- Immune protection



According to the CDC, ILI (influenza-like-illness) numbers are much higher than what is expected for this time of year and what is seen during the peak of the "regular flu" season.

10/30/09 Briefing from the World Health Organization:

- ~ 1 – 10% with influenza illness require hospitalization
- ~ Of these hospitalized patients, 10 – 25% require admission to an Intensive care unit (ICU)
- ~ 2 - 5% of these ICU admissions have a fatal outcome



Written plan

- Share information
- Have key people involved, but limit group size for writing the plan, then expand the number involved for reviewing the draft
- Communicate plan existence
- Make plan easily accessible
- Change happens, make revisions as needed
